CAMP STRUCTURE

- Camp is from 9 am to 3 pm daily, and is three days in length.
- Lunch supervision is provided; all children must bring a packed lunch and enough for two snacks each day.
- Extended care is offered beginning at 8 am and until 5 pm daily.

CAMP CONTENT

- Our camps use the research and collections of the Museum as a jumping off point for exploration and adventure.
- Campers will explore the paleontological work that happens daily in the middle of Los Angeles at the La Brea Tar Pits.
- Campers will have the opportunity to connect to female scientists and peers who share their interests.
- This camp is designed to provide a safe, supportive environment for girls to pursue their interests in science.

OUR STAFF

- In order to give the best experience to our campers we keep a 1:10 ratio for all of our age groups.
- Our instructors are professional educators with experience teaching science.
- All camp staff undergoes extensive background checks and training.
