

Chaperone Guidelines

PLEASE COPY & DISTRIBUTE TO ALL ADULT CHAPERONES

Thank you for accompanying your students on a field trip to the La Brea Tar Pits & Museum! Please read the following guidelines:

- 1. Before your trip, read and review the Museum guidelines and any materials given to you by the teacher.
- For safety and security, chaperones must stay with their assigned group of students, including high-school aged students, while exploring the museum and gift shop.
 Students that leave the premises will not be granted re-entry without their adult chaperone or teacher present.
- 3. When you arrive, the lead teacher will enter first to check your group in. Please wait with your students outside while your teacher checks in your group.
- 4. Unfortunately, <u>there is no storage for lunches or personal belongings</u>. Please prepare to carry belongings on your person or coordinate with your teacher about an appropriate place to store lunches such as the bus or a personal vehicle.
- 5. Remind students to be considerate of other visitors by not blocking passageways, keeping voices down, and making room for other groups in the exhibits.
- 6. We ask that chaperones remind students that there is no food or drink allowed inside the museum.
- 7. We ask that chaperones understand that they may have a shared experience with other classes in specific add-on activities, such as theater programs and films. Please remind students to be mindful of noise and raised voices when engaging in a shared experience.
- 8. Tar seeps are marked in Hancock Park by green traffic cones. For safety, please remind students not to touch the tar with their hands or feet (poking gently with a stick is okay). If a student gets tar stuck on their person, please inform staff at the front desk and they will assist you with materials to safely remove it.
- 9. Museum chaperones must follow the expectations and policies designated to school groups even if they are a museum membership holder. Membership perks cannot be used on a chaperone's individual group. This is to ensure that the trip is equitable to all students in a school group.
- 10. Chaperones not supporting Museum guidelines and policies may jeopardize a school's ability to book field trips to the Museum in the future.
